Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Having not so long ago written to you inviting you to join us to welcome Bishop Ruth back home to Bath and Wells, I now find myself writing to invite you to join us to say farewell at her final service, which will be our Chrism Eucharist on the Tuesday of Holy Week. Ruth will soon be laying down her role as Bishop of Taunton and she steps out in faith once again, to bring her gifts of healing and reconciliation to the people of the Diocese of Liverpool.

When Ruth was seconded to be Acting Bishop of Coventry, we deliberately didn't make a big fuss - after all, we knew she would be back! It was wonderful to see so many people from all over our diocese in our cathedral on the Feast of Candlemas when we welcomed her back from Coventry, when Ruth reflected so powerfully and movingly about healing and reconciliation, about brokenness and sacrifice, and about challenge and change. What we didn't know then was that she was being called by God, and by the Church, sooner than any of us could have anticipated.

I am sure that many of you will want to join with me to ensure that Ruth receives a truly fitting, grateful and loving farewell from us here in Bath and Wells. We very much hope that you will be able to join us at our cathedral on Tuesday, 15 April at 10.00, to hear Bishop Ruth preach before we send her off with all our love, hope and blessings for all that is to come. Please do let us know that you are coming <u>by</u> registering using our online booking form so that we know that everyone will be well catered for.

Bishop Ruth's move is, of course, a cause of great sadness to many of us. She has been part of our diocese for almost ten years during which she has served faithfully as Bishop of Taunton, and as Acting Bishop of Bath and Wells during Bishop Peter Hancock's illness and the Vacancy in See. I know that many of you are extremely grateful to Ruth for the way in which she held our diocese for a number of years and are rightly very proud of her as she takes her considerable gifts to the people of Liverpool.
