Safeguarding Audit 2025

In March 2025 it will be the turn of Bath and Wells to be audited by the INEQE Safeguarding Group. The audit is part of a national programme, commissioned by the Archbishop's Council, to conduct an intensive and comprehensive review of safeguarding at each diocese and cathedral in the Church of England.

How you can help - Survey: 29 November to 31 January

People holding different roles across the diocese, including clergy, church volunteers, church staff, parish safeguarding officers, and diocesan staff are invited to complete a safeguarding survey.

INEQE have now opened the survey for Bath and Wells. This is anonymous and confidential, responses will be received directly by INEQE and not by the Diocese of Bath and Wells or the Church of England. Details of the survey will be sent directly to some of those we hope will engage with it, such as survivors, and we will be promoting it widely so we can have get as much information as possible to support us as we seek to continued to improve safeguarding in all our settings.

2025 is the year that we are required to compile a new Church Electoral Roll.

Elections

A number of elections are currently underway in Bath and Wells, including one to fill a casual vacancy on the House of Clergy of General Synod, following the resignation of The Revd Sue Rose. Any qualified candidate wishing to stand for election should submit their nomination on the Civica elections portal by noon on 24 December. A Zoom husting for candidates is scheduled to be held at 19:00 on Thursday, 16 January.

Elections are also underway for Bishop's Council, and for the Diocesan Board of Patronage. Bishop's Council members have a threefold role: the standing committee of the Diocesan Synod, the Board of Directors of the Diocesan Board of Finance, and the Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committee. Members of the Diocesan Board of Patronage are involved in the process of shortlisting, interview and appointment of clergy, and encourage appointments which are compatible with the traditions of each benefice. Nomination and voting details have been issued to the eligible Diocesan Synod members.



Elizabeth Renshaw-Ames is to become the new Chair of the DBF

Bath and Wells is delighted to announced that Elizabeth Renshaw-Ames is to become the new Chair of the Diocesan Board of Finance.

Elizabeth, who will take up the position in the new year, is an experienced leader and Chartered Accountant with over 40 years' experience in professional and financial services. She was, until her retirement in 2020, CEO of HSBC Bank Pension Trust (UK) Limited.

Prebends installed at Wells Cathedral

At the end of November Bishop Peter Hancock returned to Bath and Wells to preach at the Wells Cathedral Festal Eucharist. Bishop Peter, who is now an Honorary Assistant Bishop in Guildford Diocese, spoke of Jesus' call to Peter and Andrew to be his disciples.

"2000 years ago, Jesus told Peter and Andrew to put down their nets and said now you will fish for people instead. We still hear that same call, calling to us. The call to follow Jesus." For the first time in its history, the installation of prebends included two new ecumenical bishops, bearing witness to the increasing links the cathedral is building with the wider community.

Bishop Roshin Lal, the Community of Christ Church Bath, Bishop Bosco, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Clifton, and Colin Kerry were installed during Evensong. This is the first time Wells Cathedral, enabled by the new Cathedral Measure under which it now operates, has been able to do this.



Celebrate your church's Patronal Festival with a grant of up to £500

The Choral Evensong Trust is offering grants of £250 and £500 to parish churches to celebrate their patronal festivals in 2025. This initiative builds on the success of recent trials in rural churches, where choral evensong services saw an increase in attendance and helped foster community engagement.

Michaelmas saw St Michael and All Angels in Dinder, near Wells, filled to capacity for evensong sung by the Wells Cathedral Chamber Choir, with many attendees saying they were participating in church activities for the first time.

Living Alongside Bats in Churches Grant

As a legacy of the Bats in Churches Project partnership, the Bat Conservation Trust, the Church of England, Natural England, Churches Conservation Trust and Historic England have come together to offer places of worship the opportunity to apply for the new Living Alongside Bats in Churches Grant Fund. This is a small grant aimed at supporting places of worship who are in need of help with their roost; for example, the roost might be causing an increased cleaning burden.

Though the application deadline for this round of awards is not far away - 10 January 2025, it is worth noting the scheme is run twice a year, so there will be other opportunities to apply. <u>Find out</u> <u>more.</u>

School celebrates 50th anniversary

From Lego and cake to a special new song – Taunton's Bishop Henderson Primary School has been celebrating its 50th birthday in style. The Church of England school opened in 1974 and was named after Bishop Edward Henderson, who was the Bishop of Bath and Wells.

To mark this special birthday, staff and pupils hosted a series of events. The children built a replica of the school from Lego, and everyone at the school added their fingerprint as a leaf to a specially drawn tree.

Head teacher Rachel White said, "The school has always felt like one big family and it was really special to experience the love and warmth people have for the school across the generations."



Senior Police Chaplain steps back from lead role.

Due to step back on 31 December, Senior Police Chaplain Andy Paget has served for more than 28 years as a force chaplain with Avon and Somerset Police and over 23 years as Lead Chaplain. He began in the summer of 1996 on Bristol's Central Police District.

Andy leads a team of fourteen volunteer chaplains, serving the six and a half thousand members of Avon and Somerset's police family.

Although much of the work of Andy and his team of volunteer chaplains takes place under the radar, in the confidential space of one-toone contact with individuals or their families. The team won the Police Support Volunteer Team of the Year Award in 2023 and again, this
