Online training videos

Bespoke training

We can offer bespoke training for schools on a variety of topics including Wellbeing, Ethos and Ethos Committees, Vision & Values, SIAMS, Governance, Bereavement, Spirituality, Worship, Admissions, Collective Worship, Leadership Development, Vision & Values in a Mixed MAT, RE & Academy Conversion. We also offer a bespoke governance package of training, which can be delivered to a single board or group of boards. This package includes the following:

- Church School Governance 1 and 2
- Governor Monitoring

Bereavement and Loss in Schools

This bespoke training is for all who work with children in schools, including heads, governors, teaching and support staff in Church and Community Primary and Secondary Schools.

This training aims to equip and support staff for times when children, young people or adults experience grief as a result of a bereavement. In addition to addressing specific needs, the training will cover other aspects including:

- Responding to news of a bereavement in the school community
- The language of grief
- Factors affecting the way individuals respond to a bereavement
- Children and young people's understanding & reactions to death
- Grief models to aid understanding of grief
- Supporting bereaved children, young people and staff
- When to seek further help and support and helpful resources

The training will be led by David Williams who has trained and worked as a Cruse Bereavement support volunteer working with adults and children and young people. The training can be arranged as part of a school or MAT INSET day or staff meeting. You can contact David <u>here</u> to discuss your needs.

Staff wellbeing - staff away time

An opportunity for school staff to step away from the classroom and to have the opportunity to find space and time to be together. A time to refresh, relax and restore. Built around the theme 'Be still', this away time could be arranged as either a half or whole day. The cost depends on the location and the number of people in the group being trained. These sessions can take place in school or in another venue

Cancellation charge

Where there is a charge for one of our CPD training events we unfortunately need to charge one third of the cost of the event for participants who don't show up to the event.

Understanding Christianity

Part one – Wednesday, 16 March 2022 Part two – Wednesday, 30 March 2022 3.30pm to 5.30pm *and* 3.30pm to 5.30pm

This is a popular resource to support the teaching of Christianity in Religious Education, in use in most of the church schools and academies across the country. It meets all the expectations of the RE Statement of Entitlement and the SIAMS inspection process.

Understanding Christianity will enrich the teaching of any agreed syllabus, including 'Awareness, Mystery Value' and 'AMV Somerset' and cover all learning objectives in programmes of study related to Christianity. It provides a wide range of creative activities and opportunities to deepen pupils' learning.

Part one will cover:

- Module 1: Introduction to the resource (the pack will be sent directly to your school)
- Module 2: The Big Story of the Bible, including the big frieze and icon cards
- Module 3: The Teaching Approach, including Text Impact Connections, planning a unit.

Part two will cover:

- Module 5: Digging deeper including quick recap of Module 1, discussion of gap task.
- Module 4: Purpose and Impact including handbook overview p40-51, The Good Samaritan activity.
- Module 7: Curriculum design & assessment, including the 'Salisbury' assessment grids & final discussion/questions.

 Please note: You will automatically be booked onto part two of this training when you book part 1.
Cost: £100 for schools who already have the file, £180 for schools requiring the file. The file will be posted to your school, please allow time for this when booking. This is the total cost of the training and will include one twilight staff meeting offer at no additional cost, to support individual school planning.

Chair of Governors' Forum

This free forum is an opportunity for chairs to share best practice and hear how other boards work. This forum is designed to complement our Heads and Chairs briefing with the intention of facilitating discussion on key governance issues, and to enable the sharing of best practice.

This forum will have as its focus the climate emergency, with guest speaker Sara Emmett (Assistant Environment Officer). Sara will give suggestions on building partnerships and working with your church/local community.

She will also summarise the diocesan plans to tackle this issue as well as provide attendees with practical suggestions for actions that could be taken in school settings. We will also be discussing and making suggestions for questions that you should be asking your school leaders.

Unconscious Bias: Improving equality, diversity & inclusion in your school

Tuesday, 22 March 2022 10.30am to 12.30pm

Everyone holds unconscious beliefs about various social and identity groups, and these biases stem from one's tendency to organize social worlds by categorizing. Unconscious bias is far more prevalent than conscious prejudice and often incompatible with one's conscious values. Certain scenarios can activate unconscious attitudes and beliefs.

This session is suitable for all school staff and governors. Participants will have the opportunity to explore the following topics with an opportunity for self-reflection on their own unconscious bias and how these may impact on behaviour and decision making.

The session will cover the following:

- Diversity & Inclusion defining the key terms.
- The case for diversity and inclusion why is it important?
- Unconscious bias Overview of how unconscious bias plays out within the workplace
- Neurology of thinking patterns.
- Exploration of the different types of bias and in-groups and out-groups, examining how these become embedded within organisational processes, behaviours and decision-making.
- Manifestations of bias, including micro behaviours.
- Tips and strategies to mitigate bias.

SIAMS is the Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools. This is also known as a Section 48 inspection. This webinar is for headteachers, RE leaders, Collective Worship leads, governors and those who lead on the Christian character of the school. We will explore the 2021 SIAMS Evaluation Schedule and self-evaluation and the new organisation structure for SIAMS (Nationalisation of organisation) There will be opportunity for group discussion and for any questions to be answered.

Topics to be covered:

- Understanding the Church of England Vision for Education and the importance of your school's distinctive Christian vision.
- Preparing for your next SIAMS inspection and any recent new expectations (including Collective Worship and Post-COVID evidence)
- Understand how to develop an Action Plan for your school: the seven strands, keeping records, self-evaluation and how to provide evidence how your vision is lived out in the life of the school.

Spirituality in School - SIAMS Strand 2: Wisdom, Knowledge & Skills

Thursday, 9 June 2022 4pm to 5.30pm

How can we recognise and encourage the creation of space for spiritual development in our schools, enabling all pupils and adults to flourish?

This webinar provides the opportunity to explore what spirituality in the school context and the SIAMS expectations for church schools, recognising and valuing spirituality and implementing a school policy for spiritual development.
