- To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom
  To teach, baptise and nurture new believers
- To respond to human need by loving service

- society, to challenge violence of every kind and to pursue peace and reconciliation

  To strive to safeguard the integrity of
- creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth.

### How to use this card

In a group of three or four, share with one another how you live out your Christian faith. The aim is to listen to one another.

- Take sections 1, 2 and 3 in turn. Each person is given the opportunity to respond to section 1, then repeat with sections 2 and 3.
- If time is very short, the group may choose to focus on one section, or let each person decide which section to respond to.

## 1. Living out your faith

Talk briefly about **one** way in which you have recently sought to live out your faith in your daily life, with its joys, frustrations, obstacles, successes and disappointments.

#### 2. What sustains you?

What sustains you as you seek to live faithfully as a disciple?

- For example:
  Regular pattern of prayer
- Bible and other spiritual reading
- Worshipping together
- Holy Communion

Talk briefly about **one** recent experience which has fed you spiritually, or through which you felt close to Christ.







## 3. Deepening Discipleship Share one way in which you are seeking to grow in your walk with God and to deepen your
