Having come to faith at the age of 19, growing up in a secular household in rural Yorkshire, I've since witnessed and experienced the power of the Gospel and the adventure that following Jesus brings. Upon giving my life to Jesus and being baptised on the 4th of June 2017, I made the decision to decline all my university offers of studying Philosophy, Politics and Economics, and instead seek to serve His church. Being obedient to His call, I ended up on a council estate in the northern part of inner city Bristol in September 2017. Little did I know I'd spend the next three years faithfully serving the community of Lockleaze - first as a volunteer for a year, and then two years as paid staff, at a local Bishop's Mission Order. Whilst leading worship, doing home visits and midweek groups, Alpha's and leading youth nights, running our foodbank and getting involved in local community events, God gave me a heart for His people and His Church. In 2018 Jesus led me into volunteering for Movement, and two years later prompted me to leave my job in Bristol and move to Bath to invest more of my time and effort into serving young people across the South West through Movement on the staff team. Once more I feel His prompting, leading me to stand for General Synod. This was in part inspired by my time on the Vacancy in See Committee, having seen the important part that I can play and the difference I can make!

I believe Jesus empowered people from all backgrounds, male and female alike, and at any age, calling us all to seek first the kingdom of God (Matthew 6:33). I really value the mixed ecology of the body of Christ and strongly believe we need to invest in local churches to reach local communities in new ways, transforming lives and society. This is an exciting time to share the Gospel and I'm thankful to get to do it as part of the Church of England.
