### Remember:

a 'church' is a group of people rather than just a building or a service.

# Exploring the building with our senses Take a bit of time to explore the building with your senses. Try this...

How does it feel to be in this building? What words would you use to describe it?

### Find somewhere to sit

Have a good look around you and up at the ceiling. Listen to the noises around you and then to your breathing. Take a few deep breathes and sit quietly for a minute or two. Use the time to say a prayer (whatever comes to mind) or just to rest in God's presence.

this is used for baptisms and holds the water used to symbolically wash us clean.

# The altar

this is where communion is celebrated, the bread and wine are laid out here and then shared as we remember Jesus' death and resurrection.

# **Bible stories**

- can you find any stories from the Bible in the windows, pictures, banners or carvings?

# Pulpit and Lectern

these are where the Bible is read from and explained.

### Organ, piano or other musical instruments

we often worship God using music and songs accompanied by someone playing the organ, piano, guitar or even a whole band.
