Acorn Christian Healing Foundation

Acorn provides training for individuals and groups in ministry and skills for people on the journey of Christian healing. They provide training, service and resources.

Acorn was founded by Bishop Morris Maddocks in 1983. It has retained his founding vision in working, and praying, for health and wholeness in the Church, and in God's world, through Healing, Listening and Reconciliation; Acorn equips and resources others to do the same. Working in the UK and overseas, Acorn provides people, regardless of their circumstances, background or life choices, with the opportunity to experience the "shalom" that is at the heart of the Christian message. Their vision is Healing & Wholeness for all. Their mission is to encourage, equip and resource local churches and Christians from all walks of life to become agents of God's healing, reconciliation and care in their homes, churches, workplaces and communities.

There are four types of training available:-

- Listening Academy developing foundational listening skills that can be used in church, at work or in the community.
- Ministry Academy an opportunity to be ministered to as well as learning about Christian healing - areas covered include loss and bereavement, the Holy Spirit, Inner healing and Prayer and praying.
- Training Academy learn about prayer ministry training and conflict transformation.
- Healing Academy practical and helpful training to help set up a healing hub or start a healing ministry in your own church. There are monthly interactive teaching sessions online. Over a year a range of topics are covered including the healing ministry of Jesus, Ministering in the power of the Holy Spirit, the Bible and healing. There are also monthly discussions at the Acorn lounge following up the monthly teaching.
