

Training and Support for Clergy

Autumn 2021





As we emerge from lockdown, I want to let you know about some changes in our support of continuing ministerial development (CMD), and to ask you to reserve some important dates in your diaries.

As you know, all clergy undertake the equivalent of five days of CMD each year. In the past we have offered a menu of one day learning opportunities on a variety of topics at the Old Deanery and in locations around the diocese. Over the last year, because of the restrictions due to Covid, people have accessed learning in diverse ways, so as we emerge from the pandemic, CMD will look different. Each year there will be three core opportunities for our learning and development in which all clergy will be strongly expected to participate. These are: the Clergy Day, the Archdeaconry Days and the Pre-Advent Retreat Days. The remaining two days will be chosen and accessed by clergy themselves. We will continue to publish a wide range of free online and in person events via the website and offer a grant of up to one third of other courses which can be accessed via this link.

In this booklet colleagues from Ministry for Mission have gathered together some dates and information about the three core opportunities and also some other offers of support, events and dates through the autumn that we hope and pray will help and enable you in your ministry.

Core days for Clergy



Clergy Day Monday 8 November 2021

This day will be hosted by Bishop Ruth. We will be joined by Chris Goldsmith, the Director of Ministry and Carrie Myers, Lay Ministries Officer, both from the National Church. The purpose of the day

will be for clergy to reflect on their ongoing calling, engage with the re-interpreted qualities for ordained ministry in the church and the Vision for Lay Ministries (published in 2020). There will be an opportunity to reflect on how this intersects with our own vocations and to weave this into our own visons and contexts, including our part in the Diocesan vision for Discerning Ministries.



Archdeaconry Days Gathering Saturday 12 February 2022

The theme for 2022 will be **God calls...everyone**, **everywhere**. There will be a service on Sunday 6 February to launch the theme. The week will give opportunities to explore the range of ways in

which God calls, from the call to all to be disciples and the call to specific ministries. The week will conclude with an opportunity to gather on Saturday 12 February.

A much needed retreat day at the beginning of Advent to refresh and resource clergy for the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

Pioneering Parishes

Tuesdays 5 & 19 October, 2 & 16 November, 2-3.30pm

The Pioneering Parishes series of four webinars offers concepts and tools to move the energy of a parish outwards and to foster a pioneer culture. It is a collaboration between Revd Greg Bakker, Pioneer Development Officer in Portsmouth Diocese and Revd Tina Hodgett, formerly Pioneer Team Vicar in Portishead. It grows out of Greg's experience of enabling a traditional benefice in Hampshire to host a pioneer team, and over time also enable its regular congregation to become more pioneering. The tools offer a process of gradual change management in parishes and an understanding of pioneering for all. Considering retirement?

This autumn, a pre-retirement workshop will be organised by Arnold Wills with input from financial planners, the pension board, a GP and solicitor. This is for clergy who are between five and 10 years from retirement and would value understanding more about the financial and housing implications and the need to plan.

We also offer the opportunity for a residential conference with spouses which focusses predominantly on the pastoral aspects of retiring and 'leaving well'.
