Bishop Sarah Mullaly confirmed Archbishop of Canterbury

This week Bishop Sarah Mullaly officially became the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury. She is the first woman to hold the office in its 1,400-year history.

The legal responsibilities of the role were formally handed over to her at the Confirmation of Election service at St Paul's Cathedral. Bishop Michael, who attended the service, shared his joy and sent congratulations on behalf of everyone in Bath and Wells. He said, "It is a huge joy to see Sarah take on this role and to see her bring her many gifts, skills and abilities to the work of being our Archbishop.

"Please do join with me in praying for Sarah, asking God to give her all the grace, wisdom and courage that she will need to fulfil the responsibilities to which she has been called.

"On behalf of the people of Somerset, I look forward to cheering Sarah on as she takes this new step and opens this next chapter in our lives together."

The consecration service is when Fiona becomes a bishop. During the service, other bishops lay their hands on her head as a sign that they are passing on their authority. Fiona makes promises to serve faithfully and follow the Church's teachings.

Following her Consecration, we will welcome her to Bath and Wells officially on Sunday 8 February at 15:00 in Wells Cathedral. Everyone is welcome to attend. The installation marks the beginning of Fiona's ministry in our diocese.

New Places of Worship Renewal Fund announced by government

On 22 January 2026, the government confirmed the end of the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme. This provides grants to cover VAT costs incurred during repairs to listed buildings in use as places of worship up to a cap of £25,000 per place of worship. The scheme will be replaced by a £92 million four-year-fund called [the Places of Worship Renewal Fund](#).

The Church of England's Director for Cathedral and Church buildings, Emily Gee (pictured above, centre, giving evidence in the House of Commons) welcomed the news but expressed concern about the end of the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme. 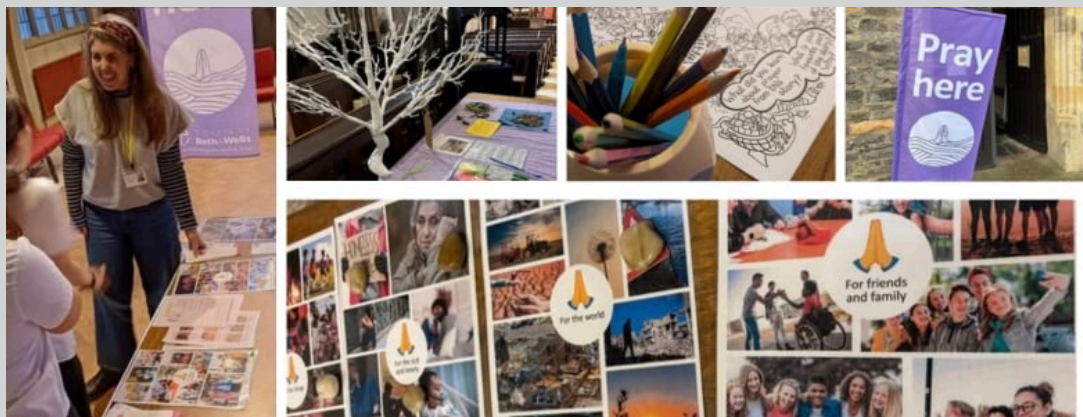

The theme for this year's Racial Justice Sunday is Love Your Neighbour. Churches Together in Britain and Ireland (CTBI) has produced a series of resources on this theme which can be used in churches.

Richard Reddie, Director of Justice and Inclusion, CTBI says, "These resources explore what it really means to love our neighbour ... and discuss how the Bible provides a blueprint for a world where everyone belongs; where everyone is loved, valued and affirmed for who they are, and not what they look like or have to offer. And one in which our identity is ultimately to be found in Christ, as brothers and sisters of one 'race': the human race."

Hosted across three Bath city churches, this exhibition by textile artist Jacqui Parkinson, features three monumental series - 'Threads Through Creation', 'Threads Through the Cross' and 'Threads Through Revelation' - this is one of the largest textile artworks ever created by a single artist.

Ten years in the making and composed of more than 25 million stitches across 44 panels, this extraordinary display celebrates both artistic devotion and the timeless message of the Bible.
